Mr. Roy Olson:

Thank you for the opportunity to witness the operation and quality of work performed by your Road Badger. I was impressed by the ability of the equipment to work in the very hard road surface and the efficiency with which it was performed.

The road has significant aggregate returned to the surface and is in good driving condition. The machine does an excellent job of removing shallow potholes and washboard.

It is very obvious that the aggregate is unevenly distributed in the road, this is probably a result of the length of time since the last gravel was added. The work you completed has resulted in sufficient gravel on the surface to delay regravelling for at least one year. This is a direct cost saving of six to ten thousand dollars, for our limited budgets this is extremely important.

I am convinced from this demonstration that the Road Badger used for regular maintenance would reduce the requirement to add gravel to existing gravel roads. This will result in continued cost savings and reduce the environmental impact of additional borrow material being required.
